FROM VISION TO IMPACT: THE STORY OF GOT YOUR SIX EQUINE ASSISTED LEARNING

For many years, life for the founders of Got Your Six Equine Assisted Learning revolved around the oil and gas industry—a world where credentials, training, and certifications were essential markers of competence. It was a realm of high expectations and rigorous standards, but it left little room for personal fulfillment or connection. That all began to change in the spring of 2024, when a certification program offered by Equine Connection opened a door to a new path.

Finding the Right Fit

Like many people seeking meaningful careers, the founders initially wrestled with doubt. "Imposter syndrome hit hard," they admitted. "We questioned if we were the right people to run this kind of business. But then it clicked—this isn't a race. We're all capable of making a difference." With that mindset, they dove headfirst into certification, determined to create something meaningful. The choice of Equine Connection wasn't random. The founders wanted a program that emphasized not just the horses but also the business side of things. "Equine Connection stood out because it's Canadian-based with global reach. The 'business park' was a game-changer—a treasure trove of information, guidance, and resources that didn't just leave you on your own after certification."

A Defining Moment

During the hands-on portion of their training, they worked with a mare named Faye, who was feeling particularly "spicy" that day. The activity involved guiding a blindfolded participant through a task, and one of the founders volunteered to take on the blindfolded role, confident in their team's ability to lead. However, things didn't go as planned.

One of the team members became overwhelmed with anxiety, nearly having a panic attack, while the other froze in uncertainty. The exercise came to a halt, and Carolyn, one of the instructors, stepped in to debrief the group.

"I learned a powerful lesson that day," they reflected. "I felt safe, but I hadn't considered if my team felt the same. That moment taught me to be more aware of the people around me and to ensure everyone feels secure and supported."

This lesson didn't just impact their facilitation style; it carried over into every area of their life, making them a more empathetic leader and collaborator.

A Unique Approach

Got Your Six isn't your typical equine-assisted learning business. Its founders bring a no-nonsense attitude honed from years in the oil field. "We're rough around the edges—tattoos, salty language, and all. But that's what makes us relatable to the people we serve." Their primary focus is on military personnel and first responders—groups often overlooked in self-help or life-skills programs.

Drawing from personal experiences with trauma and a deep appreciation for the sacrifices made by those in uniform, they've created a space where these individuals can feel understood and supported. "We're not here to sugarcoat anything. We offer a real, down-to-earth environment where people can heal without pretending to be someone they're not."

Building a Foundation

Though still in its early stages, Got Your Six is steadily growing. The first programs ran as pilots, and the team is preparing for a full launch in the spring. Their certification has not only provided them with the skills to facilitate impactful sessions but also the confidence to approach potential collaborators like therapists and nonprofits.

One of their biggest lessons? Start small. "The certification taught us that perfection isn't a prerequisite for starting. You don't need to have everything figured out on day one. Just start. Healing, growth, and progress all begin with taking that first step."

A Vision for the Future

The ultimate goal for Got Your Six is to run the business full-time, leaving behind their oil field careers. Short-term plans include running two programs a month from May to October and using the winter months to build connections with local organizations. They also hope to expand their offerings to include grief certification, recognizing the profound loss experienced by their target demographic.

Why Equine Connection?

For the founders, Equine Connection wasn't just a certification—it was a community. "This is the first group outside of the oil field where we've felt completely comfortable. It's a space where everyone is welcome, regardless of background or personality. You're encouraged to be yourself, and that's rare." The certification also provided a framework for their unique business approach. It reinforced the idea that their authenticity—tattoos, salty language, and all—was a strength, not a weakness. "The people who need us will find us because they know we're real. They don't have to pretend or fit into a mold here, and that's where the healing begins."

EARLY PASSION FOR HORSES AND PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

Jess's journey began with a deep love for horses. At 14, a mentor introduced her to the idea that horsemanship was tied to personal development. She learned to control emotions, communicate flexibly, and develop awareness—lessons that shaped her leadership. By 16, Jess understood that the principles of horsemanship—self-awareness, emotional control, and communication—were essential to life success. Despite her passion for horses, she didn't realize there was a field that applied them to personal growth without riding.

Discovery of Equine-Assisted Learning

In her mid-20s, Jess discovered equine-assisted learning, a perfect blend of her love for horses and passion for human development. She dreamed of one day running a business that used horses as facilitators for growth.

Personal Challenges and Triumph

Just after paying her deposit for the certification, Jess found out she was pregnant. Faced with the decision of whether to defer, she chose to push ahead, traveling to Sydney with her newborn to complete the training. The in-person certification proved to be an invaluable experience. Jess gained confidence through hands-on practice, participated in programs as a client, and received direct feedback from trainers—all of which helped her feel prepared to run her own programs.

Overcoming Challenges and Learning from Horses

During the certification, Jess had a breakthrough moment that deepened her understanding of equine-assisted learning. Paired with a horse named Bat, she and another participant struggled to get him to move through a simple obstacle course. Despite their horsemanship skills, Bat refused to cooperate. It was a humbling experience that taught Jess the importance of teamwork, effective communication, and self-awareness—core principles of the equine-assisted learning model. This moment solidified her belief in the power of horses as teachers and the effectiveness of the programs.

Building Confidence and Running Programs

With the certification behind her, Jess felt empowered to advertise her first program. Despite the challenges of having a newborn, she managed to run her first youth program just five weeks after certification and a full women's workshop eight weeks later. The support from the Equine Connection

community, including guidance on how to advertise programs and create promotional materials, was crucial in helping her take the leap. Within two months, Jess was already seeing a return on her investment.
